The Kairos ministry team offers a never ending supply of chocolate chip cookies to incarcerated men during the weekend retreat. These cookies serve as a welcome treat, and they also symbolize the freely given, never ending love of Christ whose forgiving and redemptive grace surrounds all of us. MISSION ENDOWMENT GRANTS

Grants will be awarded this year from the Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) of Trinity Lutheran Church. The MEF Committee has recommended to the Council a distribution from the Fund of up to twenty-two thousand dollars (\$22,000).

The MEF Committee will provide a grant proposal package to all parish leaders. This "request for proposal" packet includes details of the grant process, the grant application form, and the timeline for the process. Proposals will be due April 17, 2016.

Grant requests must be initiated by members of Trinity Lutheran Church. Grants from this fund cannot be used for the operating budget.

Christian Food Pantry

The pantry provided 265 families (681 people) with food during the month of **MARCH**. Hams

and Easter menu items were collected by 77 families. Now it is time to start thinking about preparing Kid's Kits for families with children home for meals during the summer. Some items are 'food' while some items are 'treats.' A kit usually contains 1 can each of tomato and chicken noodle soup, several 6 ounce real fruit drinks, fruit and applesauce cups, pudding snack cups, canned pasta, small boxes of raisins, and 1.5 ounce bags of crackers and/or Teddy grahams. These kit items can be donated to the pantry starting now. (Each child in a family gets a kit and kits are assembled to provide the same things so there doesn't have to be a 'discussion' about differences of goodies in the bags.) Basic food items often forgotten when donating to the pantry are pork 'n' beans, tuna in water, canned fruit, cereal, and peanut butter. Paper towels, Kleenex and bathroom tissue are greatly appreciated also. Another reminder— any money donations go for the perishable items that are offered: hamburger, hot dogs, milk, eggs, and a choice between margarine or cheese. So far the money available has been 'holding up.' Often after the holiday funds shrink and going into the summer months looks like things will be difficult. So far, this season things look pretty good. Thank you to all of you who continue to support this service of providing food and help to friends in our neighborhoods that need our assistance.

■ ADULT FORUM REPORT — On April 3, 2016, a group of VU students came to Adult Forum to tell about a project they are involved in this spring with The World Relief Campaign (WRC) which is carried out by the students who are members of the Social Action Leadership Team (SALT). This year's project is to raise \$30,000 to help train Syrian medical students in anesthesiology and laboratory practices to care for the growing number of wounded Syrians. The situation in Syria is one of the greatest humanitarian crises of our time. The funds will provide 450 textbooks, transportation fuel, and instructor salaries.
