Opportunity for New Ministry Group

Trinity members have an immediate opportunity to form a new ministry, an outreach group to shelter homeless men overnight one evening each week. Our church can provide a safe place for men to sleep each Monday evening from 9:00 PM until 7:00 AM Tuesday morning.

Unlike the previous shelters we have hosted, this one does not begin until 9:00 PM when the church is not in use, and it does not require any meal preparation or shower supervision. Up to ten men will sleep in the shelter throughout the summer beginning on May 16 and ending on October 10.

Interested volunteers could work the 9:00 PM until 2:00 AM shift or the 2:00 AM until 7:00 AM shift. Two people are needed for each shift; one must be male. The early shift will complete intake information as the men enter the building. A goal of the group would be to gather enough volunteers so that each team could work no more than once a month.

Jeff Hellmers and Larry Baas will discuss the potential ministry during announcements at upcoming services. Interested parties can join the discussion groups in Fellowship Hall after the early service or at the Welcome Center in the foyer after the late service.

Trinity families are asked to support the Kairos program by providing each of our two volunteers with 200 dozen cookies, by signing up to be part of the weekend prayer chain, and by offering our own prayerful encouragement for the work of Kairos.

A sign-up board for home cookie baking is located in the foyer at Trinity. Recipes and instructions for baking cookies and packaging (ISP guidelines must be followed), along with plastic bags for packing, will be provided. Cookies can be dropped off at the church through Wednesday, April 20.

These cookies serve as a welcome treat, and they also symbolize the freely given, never ending love of Christ whose forgiving and redemptive grace surrounds all of us. MISSION ENDOWMENT GRANTS

Grants will be awarded this year from the Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) of Trinity Lutheran Church. The MEF Committee has recommended to the Council a distribution from the Fund of up to twenty-two thousand dollars (\$22,000).

The MEF Committee will provide a grant proposal package to all parish leaders. This “request for proposal” packet includes details of the grant process, the grant application form, and the timeline for the process. **Proposals are due this Sunday, April 17.**

Grant requests must be initiated by members of Trinity Lutheran Church. Grants from this fund cannot be used for the operating budget.

Grants from this fund should be targeted for the following areas of ministry: **1)** Outreach into the local community; **2)** ELCA Church-wide ministries; **3)** Extraordinary programs, capital improvements, or other ministry initiatives

If you would like to submit a request, complete the grant application form and return it to the church office. Additional copies of “request for proposal” packet are available upon request in the church office.

Christian Food Pantry

The pantry provided 265 families (681 people) with food during the month of **MARCH**. Hams and Easter menu items were collected by 77 families. Now it is time to start thinking about preparing Kid's Kits for families with children home for meals during the summer. Some items are 'food' while some items are 'treats.' A kit usually contains 1 can each of tomato and chicken noodle soup, several 6 ounce real fruit drinks, fruit and applesauce cups, pudding snack cups, canned pasta, small boxes of raisins, and 1.5 ounce bags of crackers and/or Teddy grahams. These kit items can be donated to the pantry starting now. (Each child in a family gets a kit and kits are assembled to provide the same things so there doesn't have to be a 'discussion' about differences of goodies in the bags.) Basic food items often forgotten when donating to the pantry are pork 'n' beans, tuna in water, canned fruit, cereal, and peanut butter. Paper towels, Kleenex and bathroom tissue are greatly appreciated also. Another reminder— any money donations go for the perishable items that are offered: hamburger, hot dogs, milk, eggs, and a choice between margarine or cheese. So far the money available has been 'holding up.' Often after the holiday funds shrink and going into the summer months looks like things will be difficult. So far, this season things look pretty good. Thank you to all of you who continue to support this service of providing food and help to friends in our neighborhoods that need our assistance.

APRIL 17 - Adult Forum will welcome James Cooper to talk about a disability rights group he formed called 3-D — Disabilities and Disorders with Dignity.

When Cooper was a young boy he was diagnosed with Duchenne muscular dystrophy and as an adult must use a wheelchair for mobility, but he has not let his condition define him. He is involved in social justice issues and wants to make life better for people with disabilities. He and his organization strive to make people aware of their own prejudices against disabled people. Cooper wants to use his gifts and his life experiences to teach others to be positive and to strive for their highest potential in life. Mary Jo Nuland will join Mr. Cooper in providing information about the 3-D organization and in our discussion. Everyone is welcome to come to Adult Forum.

APRIL 24 and MAY 1 - Adult Forum will honor teachers by showing and discussing the documentary “Rise Above the Mark.” The film focuses on Indiana’s struggles with public school reforms—the same types of struggles experienced in schools throughout the United States. Experts will discuss how America can make positive changes to provide an exceptional public school system for all children. Juanagene Nietert and Jeff Hellmers will lead the discussion.

► **ADULT FORUM REPORT** — On April 3, 2016, a group of VU students came to Adult Forum to tell about a project they are involved in this spring with The World Relief Campaign (WRC) which is carried out by the students who are members of the Social Action Leadership Team (SALT). This year’s project is to raise \$30,000 to help train Syrian medical students in anesthesiology and laboratory practices to care for the growing number of wounded Syrians. The situation in Syria is one of the greatest humanitarian crises of our time. The funds will provide 450 textbooks, transportation fuel, and instructor salaries.
