## I'M SO GRATEFUL FOR STEPHEN MINISTRY!

*By a man who received care from a Stephen Minister*

Fourteen months ago, I was at a point where I needed someone to talk to about the struggles in my life. My pastor recommended I consider meeting with a Stephen Minister—another man, trained as a caregiver, who would walk with me during this difficult time. Trusting someone with personal information about my life was something I feared at first, but my pastor reassured me that everything was confidential, so I agreed to give it a try. I'm so glad I did!



Soon after meeting my Stephen Minister, I quickly sensed I could trust him. Part of that trust came from knowing he was trained to help people through their problems. He made me feel comfortable by not prying for information, but instead just letting me share what was on my mind. Any questions he did ask fit our conversation appropriately. Probably the best thing he did for me was not judging me for my past decisions; rather, he was there to help me move forward.

I think another significant trust-building factor was being able to talk with someone who was not in my regular circle of friends. My friends certainly continued to have a very important place in my life, but I also needed someone who could see me objectively. That helped make it easier to share personal parts of my life. Also, knowing my Stephen Minister would be there for me “next week” (we usually met for an hour each week) gave me confidence. I see now how Stephen Ministry is a way congregation's can provide high-quality care and outreach to hurting people in the congregation and community.

Stephen Ministers are congregation members who have gone through 50 hours of training to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care. Each Stephen Minister is matched with a hurting person—men are paired with men, women with women—and meets weekly with that person to listen, care, pray, and encourage. Stephen Ministers care for those dealing with grief, divorce, job loss, hospitalization, financial struggles, loneliness, convalescence, terminal illness, and many other life difficulties.

## Medical Mission Trip to Guatemala

Sandy Belancin will be going to Guatemala in late October on a medical mission trip. She is in need of supplies and monetary donations. There is a box in the foyer designated for these donations. Below is the list of first aid supplies and medications needed for the clinic:

- Tylenol (child/adult - liquid)
- Ibuprofen (child/adult - liquid)
- Allergy medication (child/adult)
- cough & cold (child/adult)
- anti-fungal creams; diaper rash ointments; hemorrhoid creams
- muscle rub creams (ie. Bengay or Biofreeze)
- Vitamins (child/adult)  
*No gummies please*
- infant liquid vitamins
- toothpaste/brushes
- soaps
- anti-diarrheal;
- stool softeners
- antacid/GI meds (Pepcid or Zantac)
- antibiotic/Neosporin cream
- anti-itch creams
- eye & ear drops;
- eye patches
- band aids; gauze/tape
- medicine cups
- ear thermometers
- lubricating gel

### **Prescription Medications:**

- Prednisone or Solumedrol dose packs
- Mebendazole (anti-parasitic)  
*This is hard to get. If anyone has connections with an ID doctor, please beg for this!*
- Acyclovir 200 mg (anti-viral)
- Diflucan 150 mg (oral anti-fungal)
- Macrobid 100 mg (anti-microbial for pregnancy)
- Metronidazole 500 mg (can be used in pregnancy, PID, vaginitis)
- Amoxicillin
- Keflex
- Levaquin
- Augmentin
- Pediatric Antibiotics:  
Amoxicillin 250 mg or 400 mg/5 ml  
Cephalexin 250 mg/5 ml

## Christian Food Pantry - July Report

END OF JULY ALREADY!?! During the month, 273 families were served providing food for 654 individuals. Since school starts August 14, there are only 3 more days for Kid's Kits (113 kits were given out in July). We are well supplied for making kits to finish out for this summer. Thanks for those generous donations! One dad had forgotten to pick up the kit for his daughter. She was so disappointed that he made a special trip back for it. Guess that is a testimony to the kits being appreciated.

In September, laundry detergent will be offered as an 'extra' – kind of a “back to school” item. Often the schools request that each child bring in a box of tissues. That would be a good September donation along with a detergent (any size).

Juices of all flavors are always appreciated. It will be warm for a while yet so 'summer drinks' are well received. Fresh vegetables are being donated with some clients ready to learn new recipes for preparation. We have several volunteers that can readily help with fun ideas.

With a couple of congregations doing a 'special Sunday' a month and continuous faithful giving from others, the shelves are nicely 'filled' to begin the fall season. It was a 'no-worry serve' summer with lots of help with continuous donations that seemed to have started with the great postal drive in May. It won't take long for these supplies to be served and the usual items will need to be replenished. It should be easy to remember: If you use it, a client family will need it. Thanks to Strack and Van Til and another source which breads, buns, and sweets are generously donated. The sliced bread is greatly enjoyed. A special crew of extra volunteers pick up those items on a daily basis. Another 'crew' picks up items purchased at Aldi's each day the pantry is open. We couldn't have managed this 35-year old program without lots of VOLUNTEERS!!!!!! Let's all keep up the good work to help our 'neighbors' through tough times.

## Canned Fruit & Pork 'n' Beans

Trinity members are asked to meet a Christian Food Pantry need by donating food items in high demand at the center. This August we will focus on **canned fruit** and **pork 'n' beans**. These staple items move rapidly, and a fresh supply will free up cash donations to purchase perishable items such as milk, cheese, and meat. Of course, donations of any kind, either cash or food items, are always appreciated.

Trinity is one of seven churches supporting The Christian Food Pantry housed at the Asbury Center of First Methodist Church across the street from our location. The pantry continues to supplement families by providing food staples to those who are in need right here in our community. Thank to members of Trinity who have continually supported the independently run food pantry in our neighborhood.

## WANNA HELP THE Homeless Shelter Team???

A group of around thirty Trinity volunteers is staffing this year's Monday men's overnight shelter here at Trinity. The men come in beginning at 7:30 Monday evenings, many tired and hungry from a hard day's work having missed meal times at the New Creation Center in town. We try to provide a dinner for the guys before they turn in and something to go with coffee in the morning as they depart before seven o'clock.

The average cost per week to provide a meal is approximately \$60. The men's overnight program at Trinity is completely volunteer based. We do use the building, but no Trinity dollars are used for supplies, bedding, laundry, or food. The cost for a six month season runs from \$1,400 to \$1,800, depending upon how many men sleep here weekly, and currently our volunteers attempt to meet that need.
