FREE THRIVENT DOLLARS

Waiting to be Used for Good

In Adult Forum on September 24th, Julie Kissinger of Thrivent talked about three special programs that Thrivent has that are intended to help congregations with special projects. Below are some points that she made.

THRIVENT BUILDS - is a program that helps build homes or assists with repairs or renovations. They work along with Habitat for Humanity on these projects to change lives and improve communities.

THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS - gives eligible Thrivent members "Choice Dollars" during the year, which can be designated to a charity of their choice, such as Trinity. The money accumulates during the year and can be designated to a charity every 3 months or at the end of the calendar year (with a March 31st grace period). There is absolutely no charge to you. Unfortunately, if these "dollars" are not designated in time, they are lost and the cycle begins again at zero dollars. Julie mentioned that last year over \$5,000 was given to Trinity by Thrivent members from this program, but only about \$1,000 has been given to Trinity so far this year. If you are not sure if you qualify for this program, you can ask your Thrivent agent.

THRIVENT ACTION TEAMS - can be formed to apply for funds for certain projects. Thrivent members can apply for funds once or twice a year. One or more people can apply for help with a project. Julie gave several examples for Action Team funds that Trinity could apply for just based on reading our Parish Notices and seeing the different groups we have and our many missions here at Trinity and beyond.

Choir Fest

In celebration of the 500th Anniversary of Reformation, we are featuring one Luther's hymn each Sunday during October. This Sunday, October 1st, the hymn selection is:

HOD #517 **Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word**

"When the Turkish army had overrun Hungary and was threatening Germany in 1541, Luther wrote and used this hymn in a special prayer service asking for God's protection. Original references to the Pope and the Turks were later omitted to make the hymn more generally useful. The Word of God was always uppermost in the mind of Luther, and we sing his prayer asking God to keep us faithful to the word." (Hymn Notes for Church Bulletins, by Austin C. Lovelace, GIA Publication 1987)

Ways to give at Trinity Lutheran Church of Valparaiso (TLCV)

We cannot stress enough the importance of sharing of time and talents in our congregation, but this commentary is intended only to address the financial giving choices at our church. Currently the following options are available:

1. Placing donations in the collection plate (*using envelopes or not*)
 - Cash
 - Check
2. Simply Giving
 - Fill out "Simply Giving Form" located in the foyer and return to the Church office, designate amount and choose reoccurring giving or one-time gift.
 - Funds will automatically be transferred from your checking account into the Church's account.
3. Electronic giving
 - Access our website at: <http://tlcvalpo.com/>
 - Scroll down the home page to find the "donate" button. Clicking here will take you to a secure page for simple registration.
 - You may give via credit/debit card, checking, or savings account. You may give as a one-time donation, or may schedule regular reoccurring contributions.
 - The amount will be charged to your card or transferred from your account and electronically deposited into the Church's account.
4. Stock transfer
 - TLCV has an online trading account that will accept electronic transfer of stock ownership. This enables individuals to donate the value of the stocks without cashing them in. (this saves the capital gains tax, and permits you to claim the full amount as a charitable contribution)
5. Remembering the Church in your will
 - You do not have to be a millionaire to have a will. In fact, everyone should have one. Most individuals leave everything to their family, but is not TLCV also part of your family. When the time is right and you start your estate planning, we ask that you keep us in mind.
6. Other possibilities
 - Naming TLCV as beneficiary on your life insurance policy.
 - Transferring ownership of land or real estate.

To help us commemorate the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther posting his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Castle church, Pastor Tim will lead Adult Forum for three weeks. This series will help us understand what took place then and how it can inspire us in our lives and missions today. Since 1517 we've heard how Christian freedom gives us no incentive to live as God wants, but in 1521 Luther explained how Christ changes us to do just this. This work was one of his "Greatest Hits" in his lifetime, and may still be one of his most important today.

Christian Food Pantry

Money and food items were adequately available through the summer but shelves are now very empty and thoughts for Thanksgiving dinner are being discussed. All food items are needed for basic giving: canned fruit, pork 'n' beans, mac & cheese, cereal, tuna in water, and peanut butter for example. Traditional holiday food items will be needed for Thanksgiving: boxed mashed potatoes, canned fruit, Jell-O, green beans, cream of mushroom soup, sweet potatoes, stuffing, chicken broth or gravy, canned evaporated milk, and small cans of French fried onions. These items will be offered for pick-up on November 15th and 20th before Thanksgiving. (The pantry is closed the day before Thanksgiving.)

Some people find giving money is the easiest way to help with pantry needs. That works well since perishable food items can be purchased along with basic items if not enough has not been donated.
