## November Christian Food Pantry Report

During October 214 families were served providing food for 572 peoples. November was even busier with 260 families served providing food for 589 people. Plans for Thanksgiving serves were based on having served 83 families in two days last year. It was a huge surprise to have 107 families come on the first day this year. 30 came the second day. Fortunately with the donation of 100 turkeys, generous food donations and monetary help all families were fully served. Now plans are being made for providing Christmas menu items. Hopefully hams will be available to offer with sugar an ‘extra special.’ The usual veggies, potatoes and fruit will be offered with desserts from Strack’s to top off the meal. As the usual needs for basic giving occur each week the often-listed supplies are needed: tuna in water, CEREAL, bathroom tissue, peanut butter, spaghetti sauce, rice, pork ‘n’ beans, mac ‘n’ cheese, soups, fruit and money for perishables. Fortunately a large number of eggs have been donated this fall. Help comes from so many different places and is greatly appreciated as pantry volunteers work to help provide pantry services to the families in our ‘neighborhood’ that need that kind of assistance. Thank you to all who help the pantry give assistance in numerous ways. There has been much to be thankful for during this special holiday season.

## Congregation Council Update

At its meeting on December 17, 2019, the Council:

- **received and approved reports** from the Hospitality, Stephen Minister, Faith in Action teams, the TLC Preschool, as well as the Ad Hoc team for Youth and Family Ministry, and the strategic planning Groundwork team.
- **approved in concept, the focus of strategic planning** at TLC, that we will be “a place of healing” for our community... within the congregation itself and in the greater Valparaiso community.
- heard from the **We’re Here for Good** chair that contributions for the capital campaign, along with the regular general fund giving, show a remarkable 25% increase in member giving this year!
- realized that Trinity needs a “strong December” of giving to meet budgeted expenses and to start the new year in good financial shape.
- **established February 2, 2020 at 10:45 am for the Annual Congregation meeting.**
- voted to propose a budget for approval at the congregation’s Annual Meeting, with itemization of planned income as well as planned expenses for 2020.
- set a **deadline of January 5, 2020, for receipt of all annual committee and organization summaries** to be included in the Congregation’s Annual Report.
- suggested that the We’re Here for Good campaign be open-ended until the finances are received to pay for the various projects to be covered, vs being ‘only’ a 3 year program.
- heard that the **children and youth made over \$285 for WHFC** through their Cocoa and bake sale fund raiser on 12/6/19!
- noted that the Sunday School Christmas program was wonderful, and made very special by the handmade costumes by Judy Phillips!
- learned that **new member classes are scheduled for March-into-April** for acceptance at the Easter Vigil on April 11.
- noted that **several current council members have completed their terms.** The Congregation members are encouraged to prayerfully consider service to their fellow members through participation on the Congregation Council. If interested, please speak to any current

## **THE ELCA AND FAITH IN ACTION: Immigration and Refugees**

What does our church – the ELCA – do about conditions in the world? Since 1991 the ELCA has created a dozen policy resolutions and one social message on the issues of immigration and refugees. In addition, our bishops have written extensively on the issue. The following are excerpts from a letter written by Bishop Elizabeth Eaton on January 30, 2017.

“ . . . Last week I communicated with the Trump administration asking that it not stop the U.S. refugee admissions program or stop resettlement from any country for any period of time. The Bible calls us to welcome the stranger and treat the sojourner as we would our own citizens. I agree with the importance of keeping our country secure as the administration stated in its executive order . . . but I am convinced that temporarily banning vulnerable refugees will not enhance our safety nor does it reflect our values as Christians. Instead, it will cause immediate harm by separating families, disrupting lives, and denying safety and hope to brothers and sisters who are already suffering. Refugees being resettled in the United States have fled persecution because of their race, religion, nationality, political views and/or associations. They wait for years for the chance to go home. But sometimes, there is no home for them to go back to. . . .

As Lutherans, many of our ancestors faced the pain of having to flee their homes and the joy of being welcomed in new communities across the United States. As we have done throughout history, millions of Lutherans across the country honor our shared biblical values as well as the best of our nation’s traditions by offering refuge to those most in need. We are committed to continuing ministries of welcome that support and build communities around the country and stand firmly against any policies that result in scaling back the refugee resettlement program. . . .

We must offer safety to people fleeing religious persecution regardless of their faith tradition. Christians and other religious minorities suffer persecution and rightly deserve protection, but including additional criteria based on religion could have discriminatory effects that would go against our nation’s fundamental values related to freedom of religion. I invite ELCA congregations into learning, prayer and action on behalf of those who seek refuge on our shores. . . .

In Matthew 25:35, Jesus said, “I was a stranger and you welcomed me.” Our Lord not only commanded us to welcome the stranger, Jesus made it clear that when we welcome the stranger into our homes and our hearts – we welcome him.
