Covenant of Conduct

(Healthy Congregations, for use by Trinity Lutheran Church, Valparaiso)

In order for the congregation and the church council to deal effectively with issues, the following guidelines are to be followed:

1. All members affirm their right to express their opinions about the life and ministry of the congregation.
 2. The congregation operates with a direct democracy form of government that allows members to share their opinions directly with the pastors, church council, commissions, and at congregational meetings.
 3. When members of the congregation express an opinion to a member of the council, the council person shall ask, "What would you like me to do with this information?"
 4. If the member desires to have the information transmitted to the council, the member shall be invited to bring the information/opinion to the next council meeting. The time and date shall be given.
 5. If the member does not wish to appear in person, the council member shall ask the member for permission to use their name in reporting. If permission is not given, the council member shall say, "I'm sorry but I will not be able to report this to the council since we do not deal with anonymous letters or comments."
 6. If permission is given, the council member shall report the information/opinion to the council and use the member's name.
 7. At his/her discretion, a council member may ask that the member refer this issue to another council member for presentation.
 8. EACH ISSUE SHALL BE PLACED ON THE AGENDA AND WRITTEN IN THE MINUTES ALONG WITH THE ACTION TAKEN BY THE COUNCIL. Action may include: "Received as information," "Pastor and/or president to visit member and report at next meeting," etc.
 9. Opinions may be shared in writing with the council and shall be handled in the above-mentioned manner if the letter or statement is signed.

2018 Mission Endowment Grants

Practices and Guidelines

The Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) Committee will recommend to Congregation Council a distribution of earnings from the MEF of up to **thirty-eight thousand dollars** (\$38,000) in 2018. When this recommendation is approved, these funds will be dispersed based on proposals received from Trinity's membership. The MEF Committee will receive proposals, review, select, and make recommendations for the specific grants to Congregation Council.

Grant requests must be initiated by members of Trinity Lutheran Church. These funds cannot be used for the general operating budget.

Grants requested from this fund should be targeted for the following **areas of ministry**:

- **Outreach into local community**
- **ELCA Church wide ministries**
- **Extraordinary programs, capital improvements, and other ministry initiatives**

Grant proposals received will be grouped into the three categories of ministry by the MEF Committee and grant selections made within those categories. Each of the categories will be allocated an amount equal to 20% (\$7,600) of the total grant amount (\$38,000). The balance of 40% (\$15,200) will then be allocated within the groups based on the classification of the proposals.

Requested funds must be for gifts or projects of a charitable, nonprofit organization that is registered with the IRS, a church, school, or special needs, and/or special initiatives of Trinity Lutheran Church.

Funds cannot be given directly to individuals. However, an individual could be designated as beneficiary if funds are used as a scholarship, stipend, or honorarium through a church organization, nonprofit organization, or specific trust.

Wool can be woven into hats, sweaters, coats and blankets to keep families warm and dry. These products – and even the wool itself – can be sold at the local market for extra income. To sweeten the deal, sheep’s milk is full of protein and is ideal for making cheese and other dairy products. **What a BIG difference a sheep can make!**

Fish - \$250 – Give your neighbors a fish and they will eat for a day. Give your neighbors a community fish farm and training in business practices and they will eat for a lifetime. A fish farm begins with a pond, fish food, and a few fast-growing fish, such as tilapia. Very quickly, the pond teems with enough fish to regularly provide healthy meals for families in the community. **What a BIG difference a fish can make!**

Scheduling the Sunday Servers

The job of scheduling Sunday servers has always been a time consuming challenge. In the past, we relied heavily upon our music director's twenty-seven plus years of experience. She learned our names, our attendance habits, our favorite jobs, how often we liked to work, and – probably – what we ate for breakfast on Sundays. All of this work took years and years to accomplish.

Now we have a new director of music who is working very hard to learn all of this information in order to schedule ushers, greeters, lectors, assisting ministers, altar guild, and more. We need to help. Here is what you can do:

If you choose to sign up for Sunday service using the DOODLE online program, do two things. First, check each Sunday that you are able to work. Then, go to the comment section and write the name of each person willing to serve, the service you will be attending, and the specific job each person is volunteering to work. Do this each month to help Szu-Ping get to know us.

If you do not feel comfortable using DOODLE, you can sign up by hand, using the new sign-up board in the foyer. Either method will work to help Szu-Ping create a monthly schedule.

Finally, because fewer people are in the serve pool of workers, Szu-Ping has scheduled some of us to work several times a month. If we can increase the number of volunteers, then we can avoid this, but Szu-Ping, understandably, does not want to leave any job unscheduled.

Thank you for your flexibility and co-operation in helping our new director schedule the worship volunteers.

Adult Forum

March 4 – Karen Hernes, one of our parish nurses, will present information from the book, “Health Care You Can Live With: Discover Wholeness in Body and Spirit” by Dr. Scott Morris and Susan Martins Miller. This is a book was given to all participants at the Health Ministry seminar at Trinity last September. It is full of interesting stories, highlighting the close relationship between a person’s physical health and their spiritual well-being. Free copies of the book will be given to those who are interested.

Karen will focus on some questions the author asks in the first chapter: What does health mean to you? What is the spiritual element of your life that affects your wellness? BACKGROUND CHECK POLICY

TLCV is committed to providing a safe church environment. In October, the Church Council approved the Background Check Policy submitted by the Safety Team. This policy requires background checks to be performed on all volunteers who participate in TLCV programs and activities related to youth and family ministries, health ministry, or Stephen Ministry. If you are presently involved in one of these ministries, we ask you to verify with your team leader that you are current with your background check. Background check screening is required every 3 years. If you only fill in or act as a substitute, you are still required to follow this policy. If you have any questions, please contact any member of the safety team or the Church Council. Background check forms are available from Betty in the church office and can be returned to her after completion.

Final 2018 Pledge Commitments

Once again this year, many Trinity givers have chosen to pledge their time, talents, and financial resources to Trinity Lutheran Church, our faithful worship and our missions. Regular weekly financial pledges help the congregation to plan and afford our yearly expenses. Regular giving affords the opportunity to faithfully commit to doing God's work each and every week.
