October Council Update:

We are delighted to announce that Christy Holford has agreed to fill the remaining vacant Council position. She was unanimously elected at the October meeting and will complete the term that ends in January of 2020.

While the bulk of the regular council meeting time was spent on routine (and some non-routine) building maintenance and 2019 budget issues, the heart of the council's energy has been focused on the Laying the Groundwork for the Next 85 Years Ad Hoc committee work. Yes, Trinity has been here as an institution for 85 years... and now that we have officially announced We're Here for Good (our campaign to sustain the building that supports our mission), we need to spend some time refocusing our mission. Yes, strategic planning is important if we hope to remain in business for 85 MORE years.

This process includes three Listening to God Bible Studies which were held September 15, 22, and October 6 and an October 20 Adult Forum: Listening to Our Neighbors.

We hope you were able to join us for one or more of those sessions. The Laying the Groundwork ad hoc committee continues to work through the material collected from these sessions. And this is where you can help us. The in-person participants were included in many questions, but a few boil out as the most prominent.

First, as a member of Trinity, "If God has God's way with our congregation for five years, what do you see in our future" (Daubert 48)? The members at the sessions on October 6 were asked to write down three specific ideas/responses to that question for the Ad Hoc to ponder.

Second, in your role as a Valparaiso Community member (thinking as a teacher, student, a fire fighter, a business person, a Boy Scout or Girl Scout, or member of any community organization), consider these questions: what are our community strengths? What do you consider to be the three major problems in this community? Where have you seen churches helpful in addressing community needs? Where can our church help today?

This year's generous workers provided cash support, food donations, and hours of volunteer service as chaperones, meal providers, intake helpers, and laundry workers.

We have joyfully witnessed many guests find employment and housing as they begin living independent lives in our community. Still, with limited affordable housing available in Valparaiso, many employed people cannot afford a place to live where they work. Our pads program staff hopes to continue volunteer operations next April to meet our community's need to care for people who lack food and shelter.

We are thankful for all of the volunteers who offer loving care to our guests. This ministry is a blessing that allows us to accept God's work into our hands. Thanks to all who have participated.
