November Christian Food Pantry Report

During October 214 families were served providing food for 572 peoples. November was even busier with 260 families served providing food for 589 people. Plans for Thanksgiving serves were based on having served 83 families in two days last year. It was a huge surprise to have 107 families come on the first day this year. 30 came the second day. Fortunately with the donation of 100 turkeys, generous food donations and monetary help all families were fully served. Now plans are being made for providing Christmas menu items. Hopefully hams will be available to offer with sugar an 'extra special.' The usual veggies, potatoes and fruit will be offered with desserts from Strack's to top off the meal. As the usual needs for basic giving occur each week the often-listed supplies are needed: tuna in water, CEREAL, bathroom tissue, peanut butter, spaghetti sauce, rice, pork 'n' beans, mac 'n' cheese, soups, fruit and money for perishables. Fortunately a large number of eggs have been donated this fall. Help comes from so many different places and is greatly appreciated as pantry volunteers work to help provide pantry services to the families in our 'neighborhood' that need that kind of assistance. Thank you to all who help the pantry give assistance in numerous ways. There has been much to be thankful for during this special holiday season.

Note from the Minister of Music

Let us try something new this year! I would like to develop a Hymn-of-the-Month program this year. This can be a new or a familiar hymn that we can sing in Sunday services. I will take a couple of things into consideration when picking the hymns, such as the scripture readings and the season of the Church Year. There will be some information about each particular hymn in the Parish Notices. You can contribute too! If you find a recording or an article worth sharing with everyone, please let me know! This can be a group project!

In the time after Epiphany season, the hymn I chose for January is our sending hymn "***Songs of Thankfulness and Praise***". The author, Christopher Wordsworth (1807-1885), was born at Lambeth in England and studied at Trinity College. He was ordained in 1833, and in 1869 he became the Bishop of Lincoln, a position he held until his death in 1885. "Epiphany" means "manifestation" of Christ to the world. We will learn about not only Epiphany but also about Christ himself in this hymn as well. The hymn tune "Salzburg" was composed by Jakob Hintze (1622-1702). He served as court-musician from 1666 to 1695 to the Elector of Brandenburg at Berlin, Germany. The harmonization we will sing in the hymnal is by J.S.Bach (1685-1750).

- Discussed Annual Meeting preparations; Burow-Flak family will make the Costco run for supplies for sandwiches, snacks, etc.
- Tabled a suggestion for cloud-based church records until we can hear a full presentation at the next meeting.
- Discussed method and style presentation of Sunday morning announcements.
- Learned that a Congregation Council Retreat will be scheduled after the selection of new members and officers

THE ELCA AND FAITH IN ACTION: Iran and the Methodist Church

What does our church – the ELCA – do about conditions in the world? The following are two statements From Bishop Eaton on the Iran Conflict and the United Methodist Church.

The Iran Conflict

*“Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God”
(Matthew 5:9).*

The current crisis between the United States and Iran is worrisome for many of us in our church, in our nation and in the world. Our country and Iran need urgently to find ways to resolve our differences through a de-escalation of the current crisis, using diplomacy and other peaceful means.

Armed conflict and war are always tragic for those directly involved and often as well for civilians, who also may suffer under punitive sanctions. These situations are evidence of broken relationships.

Our social statement, “For Peace in God’s World,” offers guidance:

We of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America share with the Church of Jesus Christ in all times and places the calling to be peacemakers The basis of the Church’s peace-calling is in God’s final peace, the peace of God’s eternal reign. That calling is to proclaim the Gospel of God’s final peace and to work for earthly peace.

For our part, we have a window of opportunity to stop the current conflict before it worsens. We should appeal now to our elected officials to pursue the path of dialogue and diplomacy with Iran — for our sake, for the sake of the people of Iran and for the sake of the world God so loves

The United Methodist Church

.....

Last week, in a flurry of misleading headlines, many of us read that the United Methodist Church (UMC) had split. This is not, in fact, what happened. On Jan. 3, it was announced that an ideologically diverse group of leaders collaborated in a mediation process resulting in their unanimous support for a proposed agreement. If adopted, the Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation would result in the separation of the United Methodist Church. At this point, it still needs to come through the appropriate legislative mechanisms in order to be deliberated by the UMC General Conference in May.

Many of you may be pondering the good Lutheran question: What does this mean? For the UMC? For our full communion partnership? It is simply too soon to have clarity on those questions. I assure you that there are leaders, both ELCA and UMC, who are carefully and faithfully tending to these questions.

For now, I invite your continued prayers for, and accompaniment with, our full communion partners. Reach out to your neighbors and let them know that you are walking with them and praying for them, for the unity of Christ's church, and for God's justice and peace for all people and creation. This is a time for deepening our commitments to the relationships at the very heart of our bond as siblings united in Christ.
