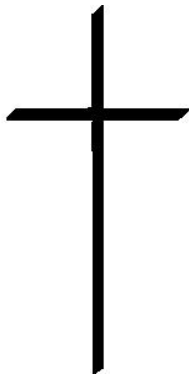

February Christian Food Pantry Report

Volunteers were glad to be able to serve 277 families providing food for 638 people in February. Several congregations had fun with Souper Bowl Sunday and the pantry benefitted well. Money not designated for food was used to buy paper towels which were offered to every family as an 'extra.' (Paper towels are an item that seems to be greatly appreciated by pantry clients.) Plans are now being made to offer Easter menu items to pantry families. Foods needed for this project are Jiffy muffin mix, cream style and kernel canned corn, Jell-O, canned fruit, jars of applesauce, 11 oz. coffees – regular and decaf, boxes of teas – at least 20 bags, hot chocolate, and boxed au gratin/scalloped potatoes. Monetary donations will be used to buy dinner rolls and hams. Pick-up dates for the special dinner items will be April 6th and 8th. Of course, through March the basic items offered each client will be needed as usual: canned spaghetti sauce, cereal, pork 'n' beans, soups, mac 'n' cheese, mixed veggies, canned pasta, etc. March has an extra Monday so 'extra' basic food items will be needed. Thanks to all who help by donating time, food items or money enabling the pantry's project of assisting families in our community who need our kind of help.

Note from the Minister of Music

Hymn of the month

In March, we are going to visit a hymn from the Philippines. Hymn 748 "O God in Heaven" is a Cebuano hymn. There are about twenty million people in the Philippines that speak the Cebuano language. This hymn is a set of three petitions, one to each person of the Trinity. "To the first person, the request is to grant mercy, blessing, songs, grace, and peace; to the second, to help us remember Jesus' pain, passion, resurrection, call to follow, and love for tomorrow; to the third, to give blessing, strength, help, hope, and peace. The peace requested from the Father is to unite us, the peace requested from the Spirit is for the mournful, and in between the love of Jesus looks backward and forward."

The melody is from a piece of old Ilonggo folk music from the southern Philippines. Ilonggo folk music is the music that has been handed down from generation to another. The hymn tune, "Halad", was adapted by Elena Maquiso(1914 -2005) in 1961, and Daniel Niles(1908 -1970) translated it into English in 1964. Elena Maquiso was born in the Philippines and studied there before she came to the United States, where she went to the Hartford (Connecticut) Theological Foundation (DRE, 1969). She later went back to the Philippines and taught at the university. She was also the director of its Ulahingan Research Project where she was very involved with indigenous folklore and hymnody.

Daniel Niles was born in Sri Lanka. He was influenced by a devout Hindu in college but later changed from law to Christian theology and studied at the University of London. He was interested in the relationships of Christianity with other religions and later ordained in the Methodist Church in 1936.

Council Report
At its meeting on February 18, 2020, the Congregation
Council:

- Elected its 2020 officers: Pres. Paul Mache; V Pres. Lu Krieger-Blake; Sec’y Christy Holford.
- Appointed Treasurer Mike Renehan, and Financial Secretary Christine Iler.
- Heard reports from the Faith in Action, Stephen Ministry and Hospitality teams, as well as from the TLC PreSchool.
- Noted that the congregation’s 2019 Parochial Report was filed with the I-K Synod, and is now up-to-date on the synod’s website.
- Learned that the AdHoc committee on Youth and Family Ministries has drafted student learning outcomes for the Sunday School curriculum, and will work on Confirmation goals next.
- Discussed future processes for the We’re Here for Good Campaign, and regretfully accepted the resignation of Larry Chew as its Chairperson and from the Congregation Council due to his new job. He nominated Diane Chilian as his replacement, and she was elected as Chair of the WHFG campaign.
- Discussed and agreed to changing software programs to the cloud-based Breeze Church Management system. It is easy to use and can be accessed remotely for the various uses and users, easing computer time in the church office.
- Established that a “Shortfall Budget Review Team” will be created, with Nicole Baumann as the Council liaison. She and Pr Tim will contact several members who were proposed as likely members. This team will coordinate with the Stewardship and WHFG teams.
- Developed a draft of a Committee Liaison listing – including which Council members serve on various ministry teams.
- Set April 19, 6-8 pm as a tentative date for a Congregation Council retreat to discuss and implement the Strategic Planning results.
- Assigned a couple of council members to research a phone system that will provide better service to the TLC building.
- Accepted the Finance Committee and Treasurer’s reports.
- Noted that Installation of Congregation Council Members and Officers will be on Feb. 23 at the end of the worship service.

THE ELCA AND FAITH IN ACTION: 2020 Federal Domestic Policy Priorities III

What does our church – the ELCA – do about conditions in the world? The following are some of the 2020 federal domestic policy priorities of ELCA advocacy specifically related to the environment.

Mitigation, Adaptation and Resiliency — Support legislation and policies that address the global impact of greenhouse gas emissions, incorporating the principles of participation, solidarity, sufficiency and sustainability. Impacts and related policy considerations are multifaceted, including food security threats, agricultural challenges, increased health issues, national security and the forced migration of thousands.

Sustainability — Encourage and advocate for important legislation to protect frontline communities and vulnerable populations that disproportionately experience the negative impacts of environmental degradation, including climate-related changes that exacerbate existing racial, economic, ecological and social injustices.

Creation care strengths of ELCA — Amplify ELCA experiential, educational and creation care value resources, expressing faithful hope for the future, at this time of pressing and wide-ranging environmental concerns.

Resources: Find more in ELCA social teaching resources, including the social statements “Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope, and Justice”; “Sufficient, Sustainable Livelihood for All;” and “Genetics, Faith and Responsibility.”
